<p>Build a Fort Use couch cushions, chairs and blankets to make a fort.</p>	<p>Sing a Song Sing songs that have actions like Open Shut Them, Itsy Bitsy Spider and I'm a Little Teapot.</p>	<p>Paper Aeroplane Make a paper aeroplane that can fly over a 3 metre distance.</p>	<p>Create a Dance Think about your favourite songs and create simple dance steps to them.</p>	<p>Church Draw a picture of a Church. Draw yourself sitting inside the Church praying.</p>
<p>Have a Tea Party Invite one of your toys to a pretend tea party and which games you could play together.</p>	<p>Invent Something Think about a new invention. Draw a design, gather your materials from around the house and create your invention.</p>	<p>Build an Obstacle Course Find things around the house you can use to jump over, tunnel under and skip through to make an obstacle course.</p>	<p>Play a Game Think about different games you could play (freeze, musical chairs, board games, hide and seek, etc.) and play some of these games together.</p>	<p>Create Artworks Use at home to create an artwork (painting, drawing, sculpture from recyclables, mosaics from scrap paper, etc.).</p>
<p>Use Your Imagination Think about items around the house you might not normally play with (plastic cups, rocks, bottle caps, etc.) and use your imagination to play with them.</p>	<p>Easter Story Read, watch or talk about the Easter Story. Draw or paint a picture of the story and write a sentence about it.</p>	<p>Get Messy Think about something messy you can create and play with (e.g. 'mud' from cocoa and water, 'obleck' from corn flour and water, bubbles with dishwashing liquid and water, etc.).</p>	<p>Treasure Hunt Hide some 'treasure' in your house or garden. Draw a map for a family member to follow to find the treasure.</p>	<p>Experiment with Water Think about different ways to experiment with water (build a paper boat, explore objects that float/sink, explore items for pouring and collecting, etc.).</p>
<p>Drawing Outside Draw outside with chalk or paint with water.</p>	<p>Painting with boxes Collect a few boxes. Trace them like a stencil or stamp them in paint.</p>	<p>Play dough animals Make animals with play dough, sticks, and buttons or googly eyes.</p>	<p>Play Dress Ups Use home dress ups, old clothes and clothes from other family members that you can use to dress up.</p>	<p>Beading Make a bracelet for someone in your family with beads, pasta, or cereal.</p>
