Milky Plastic Materials: Glass of full-cream milk Vinegar Eye dropper Sieve Steps: Ask an adult to help you warm up the milk by microwaving it for a minute or by placing it in a bowl of hot water. Slowly squirt vinegar into the warm milk and stir. Make sure the mixture is not too hot, then slowly pour the milk into the sieve (over the sink). The plastic should be caught in the sieve. Mould the plastic milk into a shape and leave to dry.
