	Inadequate response		Because they are pretty.

Mini pages <b>14</b>	<b>Point to all the oranges with the stalks.</b>	<b>3</b>	
	Adequate response		(Points to the 2 oranges with the stalks).
	Inadequate response		(Points to something else).
<b>18</b>	<b>What would you do if you had a tummy ache?</b>	<b>4</b>	
	Adequate response		Lie down; cry; tell mummy; have some medicine; go to Doctor.
	Inadequate response		I don't have a tummy ache; eat the leaf.
<b>21-22</b>	<b>Tell me something else that has wings.</b>	<b>3</b>	
	Adequate response		A plane; a bird; a bee; a fly.
	Inadequate response		(Names something that doesn't have wings).
