## Year 2 Art Weeks 3-4

Materials: A3 paper, watercolours and a brush, water, papertowel, scrap paper, a pencil and a rubber.

Look at your page and imagine a big heart filling it up. Draw your big heart to fill the whole page. Use light strokes (feathering) as we do when sketching. When you are happy that your heart fills your page, take out your watercolours.

Think of our primary colours, red, blue and yellow; and our secondary colours that we get from mixing our primary colours. You will move from purple to pink to yellow to green to blue as in the heart below. Practise making small hearts with your paint brush on your scrap paper. Remember to only use the water to wet your brush and then wipe it on the paper towel. You will find by moving the tip of your brush you can make a heart quite easily.

When you are ready, move through your colour sequence by making small hearts. Let your work dry. Wash your brush and be sure your paints are clean.

Come back and finish your heart by adding tiny tiny hearts in between the small ones in the same colour. Let your work dry.

Use pencil to add a beautiful and inspirational saying below your heart. Go over the pencil in sharpie.
